PASTOR ALLISON



These past few weeks I have been hearing a lot of stories. Stories about faith, stories about lives well lived. I also realized I have spent the past two years trying to give our confirmation youth an overview of the Bible only to barely touch the surface, barely glimpse behind those stories we have



known from childhood. Every time I open the Bible I am learning more and more about God and God's people. Now I know this should not seem surprising, after all most of us find something new each time we read the Bible, but it amazes me that we can always gain new insight, find something we have missed in past readings, discover how a story

now connects to our lives. A few weeks ago, on April 14th, I preached on God's story and how it is not finished. (You can find it on our YouTube channel "South Santiago Lutheran Church," you can find a link to the channel on the church website.)

The books in the Bible took centuries to write, collect, and be chosen as God's Word. Hundreds and hundreds of years ago the early church deemed these sixty-six books as canon, authorized as the Christian Bible. But the story of God didn't end with Paul, Peter, and John of Patmos, rather God's story continues today, with us. All of us have a chapter to write, a story to tell. Some of our stories read as tragedies, some comedies. A few of our stories may seem more science fiction than reality and a few may even have the feel of a mystery or a romance. No matter what type of story yours may seem, all our stories involve the same main character, God. God is at the centers of our lives whether we realize it, acknowledge it, want to believe it or not. We are merely supporting characters in the story of God and God's love.

I know our kids love to hear the stories of our lives. How many times, when they were young, have our children asked us what it was like in the 'old days'? Asking what we did, what games we played, what were our favorite toys, movies, songs? What are our memories? We should not write for ourselves, we need to write for our children, to leave them a legacy of our faith. Showing our children, showing others our faith not only by what we do but to leave a record of that faith and why we follow Jesus, is a gift more valuable, more precious than anything on earth. How would you write your story? Would it read like a biography with facts, dates, and a few historical events sprinkled in? Would you write a story using fictional names? Places? Events? Maybe your story would be more of a children's fairytale? Or a modern American classic.

I realize for many of us it is hard to sit down and write our story. I know it is hard for me to write about myself, I feel everyone knows everything there is to know about me or that my life is boring, and no one would be interested. Even though I feel this way, I also recognize the need to leave a written record of my faith. Let's start together, answer a simple yet very complex question WHY JESUS? Why are you a Christian? Why is Jesus important to you and for you? There are no requirements for what you write other than you tell your story. Why is Jesus your Savior? In a world full of religions and faith practices, Why Jesus? Why do you choose to follow Jesus? I would be very interested in reading what you write if you are willing to share with me. I will be sharing my Why Jesus? Story with you next month.


