

Pastor's Report—Pastor Angela LaMoore

Dear Friends in Christ,

Let me start by saying that it has been a joy serving as your pastor this year. Despite the continuing shifts in leadership – Pastor Daryl's deployment, my stepping into a new role, Pastor Hollie Holt-Woehl joining us and blessing us with her gifts and experience – this congregation has taken it all in stride



with grace-filled hearts and welcoming arms, and I thank you for that. Christ is the solid rock on which this church stands, and where he is, there the church shall be, regardless of who occupies the big office.

With that, I report to you that this past year, I participated in 13 baptisms, presided or assisted at 2 funerals, celebrated First Communion with 23 children and their families, and walked with 10 young men and women as they affirmed their baptism.

We once again had over 60 children enrolled in our Kingdom Kids and Breakfast Club Sunday school programs, this year spearheaded by the very talented Carla Griffin and a battalion of 20 parents and teachers. Likewise, our 35 confirmation students continue to meet each Wednesday to explore their faith, to learn more of the nuts-and-bolts of Lutheran Christianity, and to develop their understanding of God through spiritual practice, service, and fellowship. All of this would not be possible without our seven small group leaders, nor without all of the individual parents and mentors who continue to walk with their students during this vital time.

On the whole, we as a staff have continued to build upon the foundations that Pastor Daryl and I laid for us last year, and we hope to continue to follow along the path the Holy Spirit has set before us. This year marks the twenty-year anniversary of the fire that claimed our church building on January 22, 2000, and we intend to spend time reflecting upon that history. But even more, we hope to explore the ways in which God has pulled this congregation from those ashes into a new life and a new mission.

As I've said elsewhere, I have great expectations for 2020. I expect to see God's presence moving in and among our congregation. I expect God to use me and all of us in new and unexpected ways. I expect to be surprised by love and generosity and hope. I expect the Spirit of God to change things – to change my heart, to change our church, to change the world – for the better. And I expect us all to be invited by that same Spirit, whether nudged or prodded or shoved, into the things God is already up to among us.

I am excited to see what God has for us this year and to continue on this journey with you!

OUR PURPOSE


We are a congregation that seeks changed lives through the power of the Holy Spirit by forming and sustaining life-long personal faith in God through Christ Jesus.

Worship is central to who we are as a congregation—as one body, we come to the foot of the cross to be fed by God's word and strengthened by God's presence. Recognizing that



REACHING



TEACHING

At every level, our base mission is the same: we aspire to share and experience the Living God in Jesus Christ. This year, around 60 children have been earning the stories of the Bible as part of our Kingdom Kids and Breakfast Club Sunday school classes, spearheaded by superintendent Carla Griffin. Our 35 confirmation students meet each Wednesday night to continue to develop an understanding of their faith, asking questions and trying different spiritual practices on for size. Our Senior High group meets at the same time, this year working their way through the Gospel of Mark. Not to be forgotten, there are a variety of ongoing adult Bible study groups as well as adult classes offered throughout the year.
