PASTOR ALLISON

"I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have being. May my meditation be pleasing to him, for I rejoice in the Lord. Let sinners be consumed from the earth, and let the wicked be no more. Bless the Lord, O my soul. Praise the Lord!" Psalms 104:33-35



I love singing. I have never been a great singer, but I did participate in choir in school, and I was a member of the church choir many, many years ago. I have loved to sing since I used to sing along with my Partridge Family albums and Casey Kassim's Top Forty Countdown on KDWB back in the nineteen seventies. I have not made it a secret that I can no longer sing. I have tried to lead worship and sing the liturgy, but if you were around that Sunday, well you know what a disaster that was. Yet, that has not stopped me from singing whenever I get the chance, much to my children's displeasure. You see, they can actually sing and have good voices.

A love of music, an appreciation of music stays with us our entire lives. One of the most treasured memories I have of my mother in her last few months was the day I walked into the memory unit she was living in and saw her in worship. The chaplain was just finishing up her service so I stood in the back of the room where I could watch the residents without interrupting them. They said the Lord's Prayer and then Pastor Jan handed out song sheets and said "Let's sing a song or two." They started singing "Kumbaya," my mother stopped Pastor Jan and told her the words meant 'come by here,' Pastor Jan told her she was right, and mom insisted those were the only correct words to sing and would only sing them. After the song was over, they sang "Amazing Grace" and Pastor Jan started picking up the song sheets. By the time Pastor Jan was finished, mom's head was down on the table, and she had withdrawn again. I had never in my life heard mom sing "Kumbaya" let alone realized she knew what the words meant. My mother was never one to sing along to the radio, she never went to a concert unless dad took her to a pops concert at Orchestra Hall. Usually, mom told us to turn the racket off whenever we played any music other than Christmas songs. Yet in those final weeks, through the haze created by the Alzheimer's and the cancer, mom sang praises to God. It was amazing to see and hear.

While I doubt God might find my voice pleasing today, I do know that God finds our singing, our praises, pleasing. We don't have to be professional grade, classically trained or even mediocre. God loves all our praises, said, sung, or rapped. We are repeatedly told to sing our praises to the Lord in the Psalms. On Sundays we are given the opportunity to learn and sing three different hymns. On the sermon note form the confirmation youth are expected to fill out, they need to list the three hymns and let me know which one of the hymns speaks the strongest to them, which line, or words. Music is such an important part of our worship. We sing to praise God, to voice our pain and laments, to give our thanks for all the gifts we have been given. Music expresses so much more than we can say.

On Palm Sunday our choir blessed us once again with a cantata. This music was beautiful and helped many of us refocus on the meaning of this season. The music helped us remember that God sacrificed Jesus Christ for us, for our salvation. Let us carry both this music and this message with us as we sing God's praises all the days of our lives.


